**Seasonal Dorayaki (Jam-filled Sponge Cake)**

Usually, Japanese Dorayaki sponge cakes are filled with a sweet red bean paste, but at Tanbo they're transformed into something almost like western cakes with their seasonal fruit variations, like strawberry in spring, or grape in autumn! (235 yen each)

**Anpo Gaki (Persimmon)**

With its soft texture, intense persimmon aroma and rich, sweet flavor, the Anpo Gaki has a long history of being a favorite dessert in the Japanese countryside. It's made using the cold winter climate, so are only available during November to February. 1 bag is approx. (750 yen) \*Prices may be subject to change depending on time of purchase.

**Atsukashi-san (Japanese Sake)**

This "sake" is no ordinary one. It's made from the most delicious rice made in Fukushima, the "Ten no Tsubu" (Drop of Heaven), and is considered almost a rarity. They are released each year in December, but quantities are limited so be sure to pick one up if you come across a bottle!

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**Abura Pan (Fried Bread)**

This soft wheat-flour bread is filled with red bean paste and fried to create a delicious crunchy outer layer. At only 152yen each they are very popular and often sell out! Get yours where they are hot.
